Expert talk on optical sensors was delivered by Prof.N.J.Vasa was aimed to give an introduction to optical sensors and its various applications. The participants gave an excellent rating to the programme.

Expert talk on Human Motion Identification from video clips was delivered by Prof K.K.Biswas of IIT, Delhi.The talk was mainly concentrating on pattern recognition in the field of image processing. Report of the Programmes

Micro manufacturing -The objective of the course was to acquaint the participants with the principles, basic machine tools and developments in the micro manufacturing courses, micro and nano metrology and research trends in the area of micro manufacturing processes. The course provided great exposure, networking with peers in other prominent institutions and helped to learn about the new developments and new teaching paradigms.

Pedagogy - Seven faculty members have attended the Pedagogy training at Teaching and Learning Centre, IIT Madras. The various sessions in the three day training program were handled by eminent faculty members from IIT Madras. The need of adopting various teaching methodology and the necessity of collecting feedback from the students were explained. Open discussions and group activities made the program very interesting and enlightening. The participants got a clear insight into the changes to be made in the class room teaching. The faculty decided to adopt the new techniques to make the learning process happening within the classroom itself so that the teaching becomes highly effective.

Network simulator 3 – NS-3 is a discrete event emulator for Internet systems targeted primarily for research and educational use. The course helped the faculty for implementation of network projects in the college.

Smart Grid and Renewable Energy- The programme emphasized on various concepts of power system and emerging technologies in this field and also impart knowledge on issues relating to smart grid and renewable energy sources. A detailed overview on renewable energy resources, the role of smart grid in integration of renewable energy sources, idea about Automatic metering Infrastructure(AMI) and net metering for renewable sources, implementation issues of Low Voltage Ride through (LVRTand power quality analysis were handled in various sessions.

- 2. It was also decided to circulate the minutes among all BOG members before sending to the Hon'ble Chairman for approval.

1.2 Report on the action taken/action pending on the pertinent decisions in the7th Meeting of the Board of Governors held on 05-05-2015 at College of Engineering Cherthala

Discussion:

The BOG took note of the Action Taken Report (ATR) and approved. On a related note the Director of SPFU commented that the revised Institutional Development Plan (IDP), Governance Development Plan (GDP) and Master Plan for CE Cherthala should be discussed in the forthcoming BOG meetings and that the practice of presenting Annual Report on Institutional Performance should be started. The Principal reported that GDP and IDP were discussed in the previous meeting, but can be discussed in greater detail in the next meeting. The BOG took note of the draft brochures prepared for the proposed International Conferences in September 2016 and approved. The Hon'ble Chairman instructed to enlist resource persons from R&D institutions such

as NPOL for the conference in various capacities. The SPFU Director also instructed to report on the progress in the conduct of the International Conferences in the all the forthcoming BOG meetings. The SPFU Director also suggested that the expenditure for the Conferences should be audited by a Chartered Accountant and the expenditure for hiring a Chartered Accountant should also be included in the budget for the conferences. The Chartered Accountant maybe paid as per Government norms. The Hon'ble Chairman opined that the previous experience in the conduct of International Conference on Information Systems ICIS-14 by the College will definitely help. The Director said that although he was not able to attend the conference, he had understood from various reports that the conference was excellently conducted and said that the Principal, TEQIP Coordinator and the team behind the conference needed to be congratulated. The BOG unanimously approved this. The SPFU Director said that the BOG should discuss the proposal for giving prize money for the student contests proposed to be conducted along with the conference. He said that he was of the personal opinion that this should be done if the students are meritorious, as it will be a great encouragement for them. Dr. V P Devasia expressed apprehension whether this was within the ambit if the Institution to decide and whether such prize money can be given to students of other colleges also. Mr Jacob Mathew opined that such awards should be linked to the utility to the industry and to the society. The Director said that the BOG can make the appropriate decision which will be binding and that the students of other colleges also may be given the prize money, as the spirit of such events were to encourage research culture among students. The BOG approved this decision. The Director also asked whether it was necessary to explicitly mention in the ATR that contract faculty also be deputed for training. The Hon'ble Chairman opined that this is needed as the auditing firms seldom observe the spirit of the TEQIP programme and are concerned with rules framed for various activities. The Principal requested that an expert from Industry maybe coopted for making the Technical evaluation for the proposed High Intensity Training Programme on Java and Android and that the college had identified Mr. Shaiju MS, Senior Developer Mobility, Cognizant, who was an expert in the area of Java and Android for this purpose. The BOG approved this request. The BOG decided that the Hon'ble Chairman should write to the Director of IHRD regarding steps to be taken to improve faculty position, cadre ratio and infrastructure at College of Engineering Cherthala.

Decisions:

- 1. The ATR was approved.
- 2. The revised IDP and GDP will be discussed in greater detail.

- 3. Annual Report on the performance of the Institution will be prepared and presented in a forthcoming BOG meeting.
- 4. Master Plan for CE Cherthala will be prepared and presented in a forthcoming BOG meeting.
- 5. The Draft Brochures for the proposed International Conferences were approved.
- 6. Steps are to be taken to enlist resource persons from R&D institutions for the conduct of the conferences.
- 7. It was decided to hire a Chartered Accountant to audit expenditure for the proposed International Conferences and to include the expenditure for the hiring in the budget for the Conferences. The payment for the Chartered Accountant will be as per Government norms.
- 8. The BOG congratulated the Principal, TEQIP Coordinator and the team behind ICIS 2014 for its excellent conduct.
- 9. The BOG approves to give prize money for various student contests proposed along with the conferences.
- 10. The BOG decided to include an expert from Industry, Mr. Shaiju MS, Senior Developer Mobility, Cognizant, an expert in the area of Java and Android in the committee for making the Technical Evaluation for the HIT on Java and Android.
- 11. The Hon'ble Chairman will write to the Director of IHRD regarding steps to be taken for improving faculty position, cadre ratio and infrastructure at College of Engineering Cherthala.

2.1 Procurement Completed after the 7th BOG meeting

Discussion:

The BOG noted the procurement completed and gave its approval for the expenditure incurred. The Director of SPFU instructed that the statistics of E-Book usage and utilization of the ID Card Printer should be reported in the next BOG meeting. REPORT OF HIT ON JAVA AND ANDROID

NeST Information Technologies Private Limited was selected for conducting the High Intensity Training (HIT) on Java and Android. The contract was awarded on 15th September 2015 and was signed with NeST on 16th September 2015 for an amount of Rs.592800/- (Rs. 520000/- without taxes + Service taxes @ 14%: Rs.72800/-). The program started on 16th September 2015 with hands on training in Java. The classes were handled by Mr.Anand Maheshwaran and Mr.Pratheek MC and Ms.Lekha NM who was the course coordinator. There were 34 registered participants for the training. There were both theory and practical sessions. Assignments were given and an evaluation test was conducted for the students on 12th October 2015 on Java. The evaluation was followed by classes on Android till 16th October 2015. Sessions on Android also included both theory and lab sessions with more emphasis on prcaticals. The training came to an end on 19th October 2015 with a personality development class for the students by Mr.Benoy Paulose. Feed backs were taken by NeST group for both Java and Android. We also collected the feedback at the end of the classes and it was found to be good. As per the contract the NeST group raised a payment invoice for Rs.444600/- (75% of the contact amount) on 20th October 2015. They have organized two placement drives for the students till date and 5 students were placed in the first drive conducted by Brain Bits.4 more students were recruited in the second drive conducted by SFO Technologies which is a flagship company of NeST.

Research Seed Money. Guidelines

- 1. The objective of this scheme is to provide financial assistance to faculty members to initiate research in frontier areas of engineering and technology under R &D.
- 2. Grant will be released to the Principal Investigator of the project.
- 3. The maximum duration of the project will be one year from the date of start of the project.
- 4. Assistance will be given to secure sponsored research and consultancy projects from other funding agencies or industries.
- 5. The maximum amount of seed money will be Rs. 1 lakhs per Principal Investigator.
- 6. Proposals for financial assistance will be screened and approved by the Research Guidance Committee (RGC).
- 7. The investigators shall make a presentation of the outcome of the research before RGC.
- 8. The maximum amount permissible to each Principal Investigator for the Research Assistance, eligibility, terms and conditions etc will be finalized by the RGC.
- 9. The progress report and utilization of funds shall be reported every three months.
- 10. The monitoring and evaluation of the research shall be carried out by the RGC.
- 11. The final report and statement of expenditure shall be submitted after successful completion of the project.
- 12. The whole or part of the granted money remaining unutilized within the prescribed time limit should be refunded.
- 13. Seed money can be used:
 - ➤ To meet travel expenses, boarding and lodging charges and sundry expenses/allowances of investigators as per applicable norms and rules.
 - To pay fees charged for availing research facilities (other than parent institution).
 - For buying consumables necessary for doing research.
 - ➤ To meet the expenses for preparing the project proposals to be submitted to funding agencies.
- 14. The investigator should submit at least one proposal to funding agencies like AICTE, DST etc. based on the research carried out using seed money.
- 15. The other outcomes of the project may be publication of research papers and obtaining patents.
- 16. A soft copy and four hardcopies of the proposal should be submitted.
